Art. 1 – Subject, benefits and duration

The general objective of the UNICORE 7.0 project is to promote the right to higher education for refugees through study corridors to Italy.

Art. 1.1. National Project Partners

The project is jointly promoted by a consortium of partners:

- United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR)
- Caritas Italiana
- Diaconia Valdese
- Centro Astalli
- Banca Etica
- Gandhi Charity
- Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI)
- University for Foreigners of Perugia
- University for Foreigners of Siena
- The universities signing the cooperation agreement for the project "University Corridors for Refugees" 7.0 (2025/2027)", including the University of Tuscia.

The benefits are intended for holders of International Protection, certified by UNHCR, living in Ethiopia, India, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe, who will register in the Second cycle (Master) degree programme <u>Security and Human Rights</u>, taught in English, at the University of Tuscia for the A.Y. 2025-26 and 2026-27.

Art. 1.2 - Supports and benefits offered

Beneficiaries of the UNICORE 7.0 project will benefit of support in:

- pre-enrolling at the Italian Embassy in the Country of residence and carrying out immigration procedures (Visa and preparation of supporting documents) assisted by UNHCR local representatives;
- full tuition fee reduction (in any case the student must pay € 156 for taxes and revenue stamp- amount subject to change for A.Y. 2025-26);
- € 7.000 (gross of Irap 8.5% borne by the Institution), i.e. € 6,451.60 (net of Irap borne by the Institution). The amount will be shifted in three payments: the first payment (€ 900 gross of Irap 8.5% borne by the Institution) will be paid in cash at the arrival, the second (€ 2.100 gross of Irap 8.5% borne by the Institution) will be paid as soon

as the student will open a bank account, the third installment will be paid in March 2026, subject to the achievement of merit requirements;

- Psychological support provided by University of Tuscia;
- free Italian course provided by the language center of the University of Tuscia;
- Assistance of the staff of the International Student Office of University of Tuscia (email: international@unitus.it) for any problem related to the enrolment procedure.

Art. 2 - Incompatibility

The UNICORE 7.0 study grants cannot be combined with:

- merit-based study grants/prizes issued by the University of Tuscia for international students;
- study grants issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI);
- CRUI grants for beneficiaries of international protection;
- study grants issued by foreign governmental bodies or institutions aimed at assisting the enrolment of international students at Italian Universities;
- scholarships provided by the institution for the right to study (LazioDiSCo).

Art. 3 - Admission requirements

Application is open exclusively to candidates who:

- 1. Are residing in Ethiopia, India, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe and have been recognized refugee status in these countries in collaboration with UNHCR;
- 2. Hold a qualification valid for admission to the chosen Second Cycle Degree Programme;
- 3. Have a Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0 according to the country of graduation tertiary education grading system or equivalent according to the comparable table issued by the Italian Ministry of Education;
- 4. Hold a degree obtained in or after 2020 and no later than the call deadline;
- 5. Meet the specific admission requirements of the Second Cycle Degree Programme;
- 6. Have never been enrolled in a degree program at any of the Partner Universities before;
- 7. Proficiency in the English language is required.

Art. 4 – Selection criteria and application documents

Applicants are selected on the basis of the selection criteria and application documents as mentioned in the following article.

Art. 4.1 - Selection criteria and evaluation committee

For the University of Tuscia the evaluation will be carried out by a Selection Committee appointed by the Rector and composed by Professor Daniela Vitiello (Teaching staff in charge of the project), a member of the International Student Office, the Professor in charge of the Master Programmes concerned - or her/his delegates – and any other relevant teaching staff or third party designated by the University of Tuscia or the relevant Professors Board.

Art. 4.2 - Application documents

Applicants are required to submit the following mandatory documentation:

- 1. Select the University of Tuscia and apply for the master's degree program "Security and Human rights" through this link: <u>UNHCR UNICORE 7.0</u>;
- 2. Refugee ID card or Proof of refugee registration;
- 3. An official certificate confirming the qualification required for admission to the chosen degree programme;
- 4. An official transcript of exams passed and relative marks;
- 5. GPA documentation;
- 6. A detailed Curriculum Vitae (CV);
- 7. A motivation letter (maximum one A4 page).
- 8. any relevant and additional document in line with the specific programmes chosen;

All documents must be in English or Italian.

All documents in any language other than Italian or English must be supported by a translation into English or Italian. Winners of the grant will have to obtain a Declaration of value by the Italian embassy in order to be accepted and enrolled.

Art. 4.3 - Deadlines and modalities

Applications can be sent from 3 March 2025 to 18 April 2025, 12,00 p.m. (noon, UTC +2). Students are due to send applications, including all the documents listed in article 4.2, through the UNICORE website, at https://universitycorridors.unhcr.it/. Once the application has been submitted, a confirmation email to the mailbox indicated in the online form will be sent. Incomplete or incorrect applications will not

be taken into consideration. Students are allowed to apply for one second level degree offered by the University of Tuscia and for only two universities among those participating in the UNICORE 7.0 project including the University of Tuscia. This is a mandatory requirement: non-compliance with this clause will cause the immediate rejection of the application.

Art. 5 - Selection process

Applicants are selected on the basis of merits requirements and the evaluation process is divided into two stages:

- Stage 1: preliminary evaluation of the documentation provided by the applicants;
- Stage 2: interview of the applicants.

Art. 5.1 - Stage 1 - Evaluation of the documentation

The Selection Committee will evaluate the documentation according to the following criteria:

- Academic background and GPA (score: 0-20)
- Evaluation of CV: professional experience and personal skills (score: 0-10)
- Coherence between previous studies and selected Second Cycle Degree programme (score: 0-10)

Applicants receiving a score of less than 25 will not be admitted to Stage 2 of the selection process. Only the first eight applicants in the provisional ranking will be admitted to the interview. Applicants admitted to Stage 2 will be notified by email from **May 2**nd, **2025**.

Art. 5.2 - Stage 2 - Interview

Applicants admitted to step 2 will be interviewed by the Committee of Experts, who will evaluate their technical skills, knowledge of the subject and level of English. Interviews will be graded on a scale of 40 points.

The interviews will take place from **May 5th**, **2025** to **June 6th**, **2025** via online platforms such as Zoom, Google Meet, etc.

Candidates will be notified by email about the date and the time of their interview.

Candidates are requested to present themselves for the interview with the Ration Card Number or the Refugee Identity Card used during the on-line application.

Applicants with disabilities who need assistance during the interview must specify on the application form the type of disability they have and the type of support they need. In this case, an official disability certificate is required.

Art. 5.3 - Establishment and approval of the final ranking list

Applicants scoring less than 50/80 points will not be included in the final ranking.

Applicants rankings are drawn up by the Selection Committee by adding up the results of the two phases.

The rankings are organized in descending order of points.

The two available seats are awarded on the basis of a gender balance ratio.

Only in the event that the list of eligible candidates does not include representatives of both genders, seats may be awarded to two representatives of the same gender.

In the event of a tie, preference will be given to the youngest candidate.

The list of eligible applicants for the University of Tuscia, including those not selected for the available seats, will be notified by email and published on http://universitycorridors.unhcr.it and UNITUS - UNHCR - UNICORE 7.0 not later than June 9th, 2025.

In this list, the refugee ID card number or ration number card of PoR will be used in place of the full name to identify eligible and not eligible candidates. The former will be notified by e-mail.

Art. 5.4 - Acceptance

The winning applicants must reply to the University communication accepting the scholarship within 10 days from receipt. Failure to provide a reply within the deadline will result in loss of benefits.

By accepting the scholarship, the student fully and unreservedly accepts UNICORE 7.0 project support and financial benefits under the conditions set out in the present call.

By accepting the scholarship, students also confirm under their own responsibility that they do not fall under any of the conditions of incompatibility established in Art. 2 of the present call. They must also inform the University of any changes in the declared data that may occur during the year.

Selected applicants are not automatically enrolled in their chosen Second Cycle Degree Programme. Selected applicants are required to comply with applicable provisions and deadlines, including the enrolment regulations established by the Memorandum issued by the Italian Ministry of University and Research concerning foreign students' access to university degree programmes.

Applicants will receive detailed information from the International Student Office of the University of Tuscia on the procedure to follow in order to complete their enrolment.

Art. 5.5 - Ranking scroll and assignment of available seats

In case of vacant seats, the University of Tuscia reserves the right to search for eligible candidates from ranking lists of other University partners of UNICORE 7.0. Potential candidates must meet the specific entry requirements of University of Tuscia.

Potential candidates must undergo any further selection process that the University of Tuscia deems appropriate in order to verify specific entry requirements.

Art. 6 - Renewal requirements

In order to renew the scholarship for the second-year students are required to obtain 24 university credits (CFU) by the **end of July 2026.**

Art. 6.1 Additional Renewals

Students are required to graduate by the last session available for their matriculation year, e.g. February 2028. Students who do not succeed to graduate by February 2028 can request a 6 months extension of the scholarship, at the condition to have earned at least 80 university credits and to graduate by **28th February 2028**. Extension requests must be submitted to the International Student Office. The extension of the scholarship is conditional upon the determination of effective fund availability.

Art. 7 – Withdrawal

Candidates selected as winners can withdraw by sending an e-mail to <u>international@unitus.it</u> by **July 10**th, **2025**. In case of withdrawals, the scholarship will be allocated to the next eligible candidate in the ranking. The sliding of the ranking list will end on **July 31**st, **2025**.

Art. 8 - Information notice concerning data processing

In compliance with European data protection policy, the personal data collected are processed as described in the following page available (in Italian) at: https://www.unitus.it/ateneo/privacy/.

Applicants give consent to publish their refugee ID card number or ration number card of their PoR (proof of registration) in the final list of candidates admitted to the project on the website: http://universitycorridors.unhcr.it/

The Administration reserves the right to verify the truth of the information provided. Without prejudice to the penal sanctions of article 76 of Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000, in the event of fraudulent information being discovered as a result of such verification the applicant will forfeit the right to the study grant.

Art. 9 – Conditional issuing of the call for applications

This call for application is issued conditionally to the signing of the cooperation agreement and its addendum for the project "University Corridors for Refugees 7.0" among all the parties listed in Art. 1.
